NOTE: The Prerequisites for Geography 198, 199 & 199RA are as follows:

- 1. Current Upper Division Unit Standing (90 units or above)
- 2. Minimum 3.0 GPA in the preceding 3 quarters
- 3. 2 upper-division Geography courses completed, or relevant prior coursework
- 4. Instructor and Departmental approval

Readings in Geography (GEOG 198) Designed to provide in-depth directed inquiry into a topic of interest to the student. Entails selecting a book or a series of journal articles to read, then either writing a paper or giving an oral presentation to your instructor. **P/NP Only; max 2.0 units.**

Independent Study (GEOG 199) Independent geographical research conducted under the guidance of Geography faculty. Topic and scope varies, but must be geographic in nature. Student works independently on a pre-determined research project, providing results of their findings at the end of the quarter. Letter grade only.

Research Assistantship (GEOG 199RA): Selected research under the direction of a Geography faculty member. Student will assist a faculty member or graduate student on a current research project. **P/NP Only.**
